



2010 IINC CALIFORNIA POLL Accident Response Fees: Results By Region

“In California, accident response fees are a growing trend. These are fees charged to people involved in traffic accidents where emergency services such as paramedics and fire engines or clean up crews are called to the scene. These fees are most often charged by communities looking to cover budget shortfalls due in large part to the loss of property and sales tax revenue. Because of the need for the money, do you agree or disagree that communities should charge these fees.”

The statewide poll of 800 likely voters was conducted for IINC by the polling firm Public Opinion Strategies, September 12th to 15th, 2010. The poll has a margin of error of 3.46 percent.



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“Does the following statement cause you to support or oppose accident response fees: Typically these fees are being billed to insurers to cover charges for services including the removal of drivers and passengers from their vehicles, the cleanup of spilled fluids, or even the act of directing traffic. The fees for accident responses range from a few hundred dollars to several thousand dollars.”
